Spencerport tax rate lowest in seven years

The Spencerport Board of Education adopted a tax levy and tax rate for the 2018-19 school year, which remains:

- under the maximum allowable levy limit,
- lower than the tax rate originally estimated in May, and
- within the eligibility requirements for community members to receive tax rebates.

Each of the four towns submitted their official assessment reports in July, and the total of those assessments changed from the projected increase of 2.62% in May to the actual increase of 5.54%.

During its meeting on July 10, the Board of Education adopted the tax levy at \$37,299,816, which equates to a true value tax rate of \$23.68 per \$1,000. The levy itself increased from earlier projections by \$54,237, which lowers appropriated fund balance and results in the lowest tax rate we have experienced in seven years. The last time we had a tax rate under \$24 was in 2012-13 when our rate was \$23.86/\$1,000.

Spencerport tax rate **lowest in seven years**

District officials and the board made a concerted effort to focus on the tax rate this year, in response to property re-assessments in Ogden, Parma, and portions of Gates. Members of our Budget Focus Group agreed to share their reassessed property values to use as examples for 2018-19.

What is STAR?

According to the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance, there are two types of STAR exemptions:

Basic STAR

- available for owner-occupied, primary residences where the resident owners' and their spouses income is less than \$500,000
- exempts the first \$30,000 of the full value of a home from school taxes

Enhanced STAR

- provides an increased benefit for the primary residences of senior citizens (age 65 and older) with qualifying incomes

Summer capital work around our district

- Window shade / treatment replacement throughout school
- Room 501 office renovation

- 9 classrooms floor abatement / replace with new VCT, also new wardrobe cabinet and door hardware

Canal View ES

- 37 vertical unit ventilator replacement and relief air units

Taylor ES

- Exterior door 8 replacement
- Psychology office window replacement
- Art room – build storage room

Munn ES

- Centrium renovations – art room / music room / rooms T100, 101, 102

Leo Bernabi

Dr. Bernabi was persistent. During his work life in Spencerport, he was a Social Studies teacher, an Earth Science teacher, and he was a coach. He started the wrestling program in Spencerport, and his teams went undefeated. Dr. Bernabi was also a principal and the Superintendent of Spencerport Schools.

In addition, he also has other areas that show he was a fine citizen. Leo Bernabi served in the Navy during World War II and the Korean War. Lastly, he was a role model for coaches too. He was President of the State Wrestling Officials and eventually was inducted into the Section V Wrestling Hall of Fame.

William C. Munn

William Munn joined the Spencerport Board of Education in 1966, and served as its president from 1970-75. Also, from 1972-75, Munn was the board representative for the Curriculum Council. He ran for the board once again in 1975, and out of the others running, he received the most votes due to how he'd been seen in action with his attendance and way of handling the problems.

Sadly, though, at age 51 in 1975, Munn found that he had brain cancer and had to get surgery for it. In February 1976, he got the surgery, but sadly passed due to complications from it on February 24, 1976, just three days before he turned 52. The loss of Munn was devastating.

The school named after him was because of all he did for us, and all he did for us is greatly appreciated village-wide.

Ada M. Cosgrove

After graduating from high school, Ada Cosgrove was accepted into Brockport Normal School, which is now called the State University College at Brockport. After finishing college in 1904, she became a teacher, starting out in third and fourth grade in a one-room schoolhouse.

Ada Cosgrove started out with teaching at the Old Brick School and Manitou School, but soon she moved to teaching at Spencerport Schools. She taught subjects such as American History

and Math. Wherever Ada went, she left a mark of inspiration on each and every student she taught. Even kids she didn't have in her class respected and liked her.

Soon enough, students started calling her "Aunt Ada," though never directly to her face. Ellsworth Wilson said that this name was created out of respect for her.

In 1940, Ada became a vice principal, a little bit before her retirement. She retired in 1949, and was still remembered for her kindness, optimism and charisma.

Terry A. Taylor

Terry Taylor started his musical career in the fourth grade, learning to play the trombone. It was not by choice, but by chance. His music teacher

had issued all the instruments and the trombone was the only one left. Terry became very skilled at his instrument, and began touring other schools for school musical programs. His sister, Louise, said that at home, Terry Taylor went to practice on the top (floor) of his home, while the rest of the family went to the basement.

During his senior year of college, Terry Taylor married a woman named Ada White. After graduating with a degree in music, Taylor was offered a teaching position in our very own Spencerport School District. Terry Taylor accepted the

offer, and began teaching music to the children. Not only that, but he helped build a music program for students in the school, so they could learn and discover more about music.

In 1981, Terry Taylor left Town Line School to teach at a high school level. Six years later, Mr. Taylor was nominated for the Olmstead Prize for Excellence in Secondary School Teaching, and became one of the only four people in the country who earned this honor. A little later, Terry Taylor received another award: the Disney American Teacher Award for the Performing Arts.

Terry Taylor was often described as a gentle man and a gentleman. He was devoted to both his music and his students.

Students show they CARE at Taylor

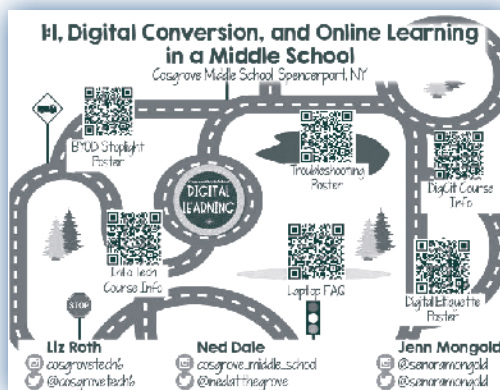
Taylor Elementary School participated in its first ever CARE Olympics on June 8. Students joined in on caring activities that focused showing kindness to others, themselves, and the planet.

The ceremony included performances and reflections from our students, as well as special recognitions. Among the 2018 highlights were:

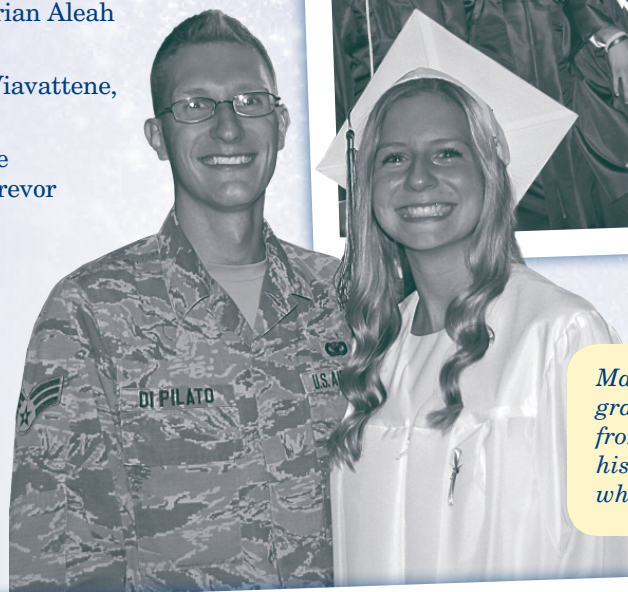

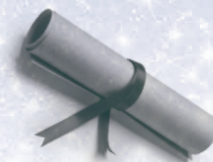

Spencerport sixth graders celebrate school namesakes

Ellsworth J. Wilson

In 1932, EJ Wilson graduated from the University of Rochester and got a job as a science teacher at Spencerport. He continued his studies and earned a master's degree from the State Teachers' College in Albany.

Wilson taught until 1941. He figured a person with a science degree would probably be drafted into World War II, so he enlisted and served in the 33rd Signal Corp until December, 1945.

In 1946, Wilson went back to teaching in Spencerport. He was a science teacher at the high school, then was appointed vice principal. In 1947, there were one-room schoolhouses all over Ogden and the Spencerport area. In 1947 or 1948, the district centralized and was named the Spencerport Central School District. Mr. Wilson became "District Principal" or Superintendent.



Wilson worked in the district for 40 years as a teacher, principal and district principal.

He oversaw the construction of many buildings, like the primary building, the intermedia school (now Bernabi), and the high school (now Cosgrove). He made sure that the schools had enough room on the grounds for all the playgrounds and soccer fields.
