Seesaw App for Elementary Schools

Earlier this week, we received information that the SeeSaw platform we use for elementary instruction had been compromised, and more specifically, its messaging app.

While working in conjunction with BOCES, our Computer Services Department quickly mobilized to investigate and learned that families and teachers around the country received a link to an inappropriate image.

The impact in Spencerport was extremely isolated; however, we immediately disabled the site. It is important to reiterate that at no time was this image viewed by students. We will continue to limit access to the platform until the situation is fully resolved.
