Dear Spencerport Families,

Last week I shared with you our commitment to focus and improve upon our student experience in Spencerport Central Schools. Our district takes pride in its tradition of academic excellence and preparing students for their future. This focus has never been more critical, which is why the board of education and leadership team has initiated a strategic planning process and capital improvement project.

Our students who have entered Kindergarten this year will be young adults in 2035. Our schools need to prepare them for jobs that have not yet been created, for technologies that have not yet been



invented, and to solve problems that have not yet been anticipated. Some of you have asked, "What does it mean for my child to become "future-ready?" There is no question that students will need both broad and specialized knowledge to navigate their complex world. Disciplinary knowledge will continue to be important, but the capacity to think across the boundaries of disciplines and "connect the dots" will be critical when students are challenged to apply their knowledge in unknown and evolving circumstances.

I will continue to share with you all the ways our district is strategically working to broaden our students' future-ready skills, including developing cognitive skills (e.g. critical thinking, creative thinking, learning to learn and self-regulation); social and emotional skills (e.g. empathy, self-efficacy and collaboration); and practical and physical skills (e.g. using new information and communication technology devices).

Helping our students become globally competent is a journey, not an endpoint. It is an evolving, ongoing process that helps students see that world events and global issues are interdependent and that their own culture and history is key to understanding relationships to others. I encourage

#### **Increase in RSV cases**

With few to no restrictions in place and travel and socializing back in full swing, we are seeing an increase in colds and flu like symptoms. Nationwide, there is also an increase in children infected with RSV (Respiratory syncytial virus).

Our Spencerport health office staff will continue to monitor the number of reported school absences related to RSV and other common illnesses. Symptoms of RSV may include cough, lowgrade fever, cough, nasal congestion, runny nose, increased irritability, loss of appetite, and wheezing. Please remember to keep students home when they are sick to help prevent the spread of illness and to seek medical attention for breathing difficulty or high fever.

Our Unified Bowling season is up and running, and the team had their first match on Thursday.


