Future Ready learning

What an exciting day of learning for our elementary students! Staff and student members of Spencerport's Ranger Robotics organized a special visit to each elementary school to build tetrahedral kits with students from kindergarten up to grade 5.

High School and elementary school students worked together this morning to apply the mechanism of flight through the design of tetrahedral kites. Working in small groups, students built their own kites using the basic processes found in many manufacturing systems - cutting, shaping, forming, conditioning, assembling, joining, finishing, and quality control - to manufacture a complete tetrahedral kite and test it during their time together.
