Dear Spencerport Families,

It is no secret that society has faced a series of challenges over the last few years. One could argue that no group has been impacted to the same degree as our students. We recognize that the disruption to their academic studies has left a void that we are working to address. With today marking the end of our first quarter, I thought it might be helpful to share how we are working to enhance our structures and systems at all three levels (PreK-5, 6-8, and 9-12) to improve the learning experiences for our students.

At the elementary level, Spencerport has transitioned to a new system called Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS). This



process addresses the literacy, numeracy, and behavioral needs of the students we serve. To help us with this work, we have tasked a master teacher in each elementary school to collaborate with teachers and administrators on enhancing our ELA and math programs. This involves refining our curriculum, supporting their colleagues' instructional delivery, using data from assessments to target student intervention, and creating systems to support behavioral needs.

At the secondary level, we have identified Content Focused Coaches at Cosgrove and the high school in ELA, Social Studies, Math, and Science. The work of these teachers is to support their colleagues as they build their instructional repertoire and work to personalize instruction and support to our students.

Finally, Spencerport has created a series of academic programs to further support student learning. These include our summer programs for incoming Kindergarten students through 12th grade, and our after-school workshops to help secondary students recover credit to ensure that they are on path to graduate. Research suggests that tutoring is an effective way to help secondary students make up lost academic ground and we have created after-school Academic Workshops to provide small group support to help students keep up with grade-level content in a particular subject. We

encourage our secondary students to discuss this option with their classroom teacher if they need more support.

Just a reminder that high school and middle school report cards will be available on Nov. 18 in Infinite Campus. Updates

Proposed 2022 capital improvement project

The Spencerport Central School District conducts regular reviews of its buildings and grounds to identify areas in need of repair, renovation or replacement. Our goal is to be Future Ready, continuously working to create an educational environment that will keep our students safe and support instructional programs.



This year, the building condition surveys and inspections have served to inform decisions with our financial advisors, construction management teams, and our community Facilities Task Force. From this collaborative process, we have prioritized each school's needs and developed a proposal for our community to consider. The 2022 capital improvement project totals \$23.4 million and proposes:

- additional safety and security measures including new secured vestibule entrances in all six schools and district office; and
- extensive infrastructure repairs and replacements, including roofing, HVAC systems, boilers and paving

The project aligns with the district's commitment to fiscal accountability in its short and long-term planning and represents a minimal-to-no impact on taxpayers. In addition, the project would provide a blueprint for a phase 2 project in the future.

- An informational meeting on the project will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 29, 6 p.m. in the high school performing arts center.
- Please mark your calendars for the community vote on Tuesday, Dec. 13, 6 a.m. 9 p.m. in the District Office building.

We will continue to communicate aspects of the project and Dec. 13 vote in the coming weeks. In the meantime, be sure to visit our website for more details or check out this brief video.




Recognitions
