## 2023-24 budget development

As we enter the month of March, we are approaching the half-way mark of our budget development process. Last month, I shared with you information on our Budget Focus Group (BFG) and results from our ThoughtExchange for the 2023-24 school budget. As we continue to create the budget, we want to make sure we are
 prioritizing what is important to our community and what will help us achieve our goals.

Last week, I had the chance to meet with students in grades 9-12 to understand what is important to them and truly appreciate their perspectives of our schools and district. Our stakeholders have asked us to prioritize smaller class sizes, improving safety and security measures as well as increasing mental health supports. We also need to focus on districtwide operational needs that require attention.
