Dear Spencerport Families,

A flood of so-called "swatting" calls have disrupted schools around the country this year, and this week Hilton has received two threats that have caused fear and a large-scale police response. In those situations, it takes time for officers to determine that the reports are hoaxes, and school and district administrators have the big task of restoring a sense of normalcy for students and their families after they get the all-clear.

I understand the anxiety a situation like that can cause for our families, students, staff, and community. I have frequently shared that we will continue to make every effort to maintain an



environment where students and staff feel safe. I thought it would be helpful to proactively review our safety and security program with our families and offer updates on our new safety initiatives. Please be aware that our work continues to be ongoing, as we build layers of security and enhancements into our schools and buildings:

- Operational Security Department. Our Director of Security, Chris Mears, and SWOOP staff are
  responsible for school safety and security in our buildings. In addition, we have engaged in
  considerable emergency response planning and training throughout this school year. Schools
  will continue to practice a variety of emergency drills, such as lock out, shelter in place, and
  lockdown drills. Please become familiar with our <u>Security Department at this link</u>
- Partnership with the Ogden Police Department. The district continues to enjoy a close
  partnership with OPD. This includes visible patrols on our campus, regular officer presence in
  our schools, continued collaboration to bridge the efforts between schools, families, and
  community policing efforts, and immediate response to any requests for emergency or nonemergency support.

- Single points of entry. One designated point of entry is in effect for each building. All doors are
  locked during the instructional day, and entry is monitored and secured. Building
  administrators have been evaluating our procedures to ensure that all visitors have expressed
  permission to enter.
- More secured entrances. The next capital project will include more secured entrances at each building. These enhancements will be an added layer of security to complement our existing procedures.
- Raptor system. We consistently utilize our Raptor system, which scans a visitor's driver license against the National Sex Offender Registry. Once cleared, the system generates an identity badge for display while a visitor is in the building.
- Video cameras. Additional camera systems have been installed across our buildings and school grounds this year. This has allowed us to extend coverage and broaden safety/security across our campus.
- Safety/security planning. The district has contracted with Altaris Consulting Group, a nationally-known security firm that specializes in K-12 school security. This partnership includes:
- Extensive safety and security reviews at all schools to assess our programs and equipment
- Completion of comprehensive and consistent building and district emergency response plans
- Comprehensive emergency management and response training for all administrators and emergency response teams across the district.
- 24/7 emergency planning and support

The events this week in Hilton remind us how important it is to remain diligent with our practices and protocols. Remember, if you see something, please say something. To make that as easy as possible, please use our anonymous <u>"Tip Line" to report something</u> that appears suspicious or might be a risk to students or staff.

Lastly, as the week comes to a close, I would like to extend a special note of thanks to the individuals who sit on our different safety teams. Your work is greatly appreciated.
