SchoolMessenger notification system

The district communicates with families using an automated system, with options for phone calls or emails. Please make sure your contact information is up to date with your student's school.

Don't miss our closing notifications or emergency messages.

The district will notify families by 6:30 a.m., when a decision is made to close school due to inclement or winter weather conditions. These messages will be :

- sent via our automated system,
- posted on our website, and
- reported to local media outlets.

When school is closed or dismissed early, all afterschool and evening activities, including athletics, clubs, and continuing education, will also be canceled.

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In case of emergency, all contacts listed for an individual student will be called. This will ensure that urgent information reaches all designated contacts. E-mails also may be used depending on the severity of the situation.

Food Services

Families may enroll in the free MySchoolBucks online system to conveniently pay for school meals, check balances, make deposits, or view cafeteria purchases.

Are you eligible for free or reduced meal prices?

We want to make sure that every eligible student is signed up for free or reduced-price meals. Details on eligibility, guidelines and applications may be found on our website >Departments &Programs>Food Services. Copies are also available in your school's main office, the food service department (district office), or the district registrar.

Jan. 1: USB devices not permitted

On Jan. 1, 2024, the use of external USB media storage such as thumb drives and flash drives will be prohibited on districtissued computers. The move away from such storage devices is part of an ongoing attempt to keep our personally identifiable information and district network safe from harm. In the months to come, the Computer Services Department will release reminders as well as training on how to save valuable documents to Microsoft Office 365.

Physical exams

To all parents of students entering grades PreK or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 in September 2023, the New York State Education Department requires physical examinations by a physician, nurse practitioner or physician's assistant for students in these grades.

When you see your physician or other health care provider for a routine annual physical exam this year, please ask for a health certificate to give to your current school nurse. This is a good time also to schedule a full dental screening for your student and to bring that dental certificate in as well.



Medicine may be dispensed in school under strict guidelines established by New York State:

- 1. A physician must prescribe ALL medication taken in school, including overthe-counter drugs (pain medication, cough syrups, lozenges, creams, etc., and antacids such as Tums).
- 2. The school nurse MUST have on file a written order from the student's physician and a written request from the parent to administer the medication.
- 3. All medication must be provided in its original container, including over-thecounter drugs.
- 4. NO medication of any kind is to be brought to school by a child. It must be delivered directly to the school nurse by a parent not transported on the bus by the student.



Immunization requirements are listed on our website and proof of immunization is due on the first day of school. For more information about Monroe County's immunization clinics, please call the Monroe County Health Department at 753-5150.

Dignity Act for All Students (DASA)

(DASA) is intended to create a safe learning environment, which:

Student Code of Conduct

The intent of the Code of Conduct is to promote responsible behavior, which will lead to the greatest success for all learners in the school community. To achieve this goal, all members of the community are expected to learn and exhibit the following characteristics:

- Responsible Behavior
- Mutual Respect
- Personal Dignity
- Personal Excellence

The code of conduct applies to any school function, on or off school property, including on the school bus. The code of conduct is reviewed annually, with revisions adopted by the board of education.

Facilities asbestos report

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) is a federal law enacted in 1987 requiring all school districts to re-inspect all facilities for asbestos-containing building materials.

A detailed districtwide Management Plan was developed and approved by our board of education after a thorough inspection of our entire facilities by Peach Laboratories, PA in 1988.

The AHERA Plan, which is available for public inspection at the district office, outlines appropriate response actions to ensure a continuously safe environment.

Pesticide notification program

The Spencerport School District follows an Integrated Pesticide Management approach for our buildings and grounds. As part of this approach, pesticide applications for rodents, insects, and weeds are only applied if all other environmentally friendly methods have failed, and pest population pose a serious threat to the health and safety of our facilities. Licensed professionals are engaged to make all pesticide applications. No pesticides are routinely applied without an inspection and an assessment of potential harm.


The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.
- Use of horticultural soap and oils that do not contain synthetic pesticides or synergists

Effective July 1, 2001, New York State Education Law Section 409-H required all public elementary

and secondary schools to

provide written notification regarding the periodic application of pesticides, as well as before an emergency



The district maintains this list and updates it yearly. Should an emergency application become necessary the district makes every effort to contact all individuals on the list, 48-hours prior to application. If you would like to be on the notification list and receive notification of applications, please download the Pesticide Notification Request Form from the district website, complete the form and return it to: Facilities Department, Pesticide Representative, Spencerport Central School District, 1 Bernabi Road, Spencerport, NY 14559. Alternately you may call the Facilities Office, (585)349-5195 to have a form sent to you. Your name will remain on the notification list for one year.

For further information on these requirements, please contact Director of Facilities, Pesticide Representative, at the contact information noted above.

District Insurance Policy

We urge parents and guardians to obtain adequate health insurance coverage for student injuries that may occur during the school day or on school grounds.

Spencerport does not carry this type of insurance or insurance covering the theft of student belongings. The replacement of lost or stolen items is the responsibility of the parent or guardian.



FERPA notification

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a Federal law, requires that the Spencerport Central School District with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, the Spencerport Central School District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the district to the contrary in accordance with district policy. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the district to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications or in response to inquiries.

Examples include:

- A playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production
- School Newsletters
- Classroom Newsletters
- Student Newspaper
- School Displays/Bulletin Boards
- The annual yearbook
- Honor roll or other recognition lists
- Internet
- Graduation programs; and
- Sports activity sheets, such as game programs

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings, publish yearbooks and media reporters. In addition, two federal laws require the Spencerport Central School District, which receives assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories - names, addresses and telephone listings - unless parents have advised the Spencerport Central School District that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent.

Parents and students age 18 or older have the right to tell us that any or all of the directory information listed below should not be released without prior written consent. If you wish to exercise that right, please notify us in writing by September 1 of the new school year telling us which of the directory information categories listed below you do not want released without prior consent.

Directory Information Categories

- Student's name
- Participation in officially recognized activities or sport
- Address
- Telephone listing
- Enrollment status (part-time, full-time undergraduate etc.)
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- Electronic mail address
- Photograph
- Degrees, honors, and awards received
- Date and place of birth
- Major Field of study
- Dates of attendance
- Grade level
- The most recent educational agency or institution attended
- Name, address and telephone listing to military recruiters
